Weatherization Assistance Program: In partnership with the Colorado Energy Office, HRWC works to improve the energy efficiency of residential structures to income qualifying residents who own or rent their home. This free program makes cost-effective, energy-efficient home improvements to stick built or manufactured homes that reduce energy bills and give a more comfortable home year-round. Families or individuals receiving TANF, AND, SSI, LEAP and SNAP automatically qualify.

Housing Counseling and Education Program: HRWC is a HUD Approved Housing Counseling Agency with HUD Counselors who offer free services to residents of Western Colorado of any income level. Services include: Financial Coaching and Counseling, Financial Capability Workshops to improve credit, savings and reducing debt. Homebuyer Education Classes for those seeking to purchase a home. Pre-Purchase Counseling covers financial management, evaluating credit, prequalification assistance, and loan approval. Post-Purchasing Coaching help clients prepare financially for home maintenance, repairs, improvements, and refinancing a home. Counselors also work with Renters on developing a financial plan on spending, savings, and reducing debt. Understanding lease agreements, landlord requirements, tenant rights and working with clients who have been evicted.

Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program: The Housing Rehabilitation loan program provides income qualifying homeowners in Mesa, Garfield, and Rio Blanco counties access to low interest-rate loans to repair and maintain their homes. The goal is for a homeowner to have a healthier home to live in for years to come, comfortably and safely. Loan

rates are typically from 0%-3% and payments are customized by Housing Resources based upon the homeowner's ability to pay.

Self-Help Building Housing Program: Uniquely designed to help people help themselves, Self-Help Housing is a "sweat equity" program through Housing Resources of Western Colorado (HRWC), that gives income qualified families the means to construct their own homes. Families who participate perform approximately 65% of the construction labor, under qualified supervision, on each other's homes. The labor that families contribute substantially reduces the cost of each home while also building equity. Participants in the program must be willing to contribute a minimum of 30 hours per week for approximately 8 to 12 months. Family and friends can contribute up to 15 hours per week which can count towards the 30 hours.

Purchase Assistance Loan: The Purchase Assistance Loan provides down payment assistance to purchase a home for qualified homebuyers. This type of loan covers the down payment and closing costs with 0% interest rate and no monthly payments. Borrowers must meet program requirements and income guidelines. The service area is Mesa, Delta and Montrose counties.
